SEPTEMBER IS FOR NEW BEGINNINGS

September is the start of a new school year with new students and new staff. This is a great time to review your safety drills with staff, especially new staff and substitutes.

- What routines does your school have for taking attendance during drills and notifying of missing or added students?
- Do students and staff know what to do when students are in hallways or bathrooms during a drill?
- What provisions are made for substitute staff to be aware of safety drill protocols and procedures?
- What considerations support special populations during trauma-informed drills?
- The purpose of drills is to practice and prepare, not to scare. Drills are to help students and staff know what to do in an emergency, not create trauma.
